COMMUNION RAIL KNEELERS SANCTUARY STEP

It was in 1977, the Queen's Silver Jubilee year, that a group was formed under the guidance of Mrs Ann Day to work on the altar rail kneelers which she had designed. A set of 5 kneelers of varying lengths mounted on wooden bases which are covered with black lining. They are of canvas work embroidery in crewel wool. They were completed in 1979. Each kneeler has an individual design on a pale blue tent stitch background and is flanked by a design of bunches of grapes and vine leaves adapted from a sampler of the same period as the church. The main background of each kneeler is crimson , worked in a square design in small rice, satin and tent stitches with alternate centres filled in with diagonal satin and cushion stitches in cherry red. The sides are worked vertically in crimson in long arm cross stitch. The centre designs are worked in golds, greys, white, reds and greens – shades chosen to harmonise with the nativity scene in the East window. They were upholstered by Mr H R Staplehurst. The previous kneeler, which was also embroidered canvas, had been worked and donated by Mrs Rowling in 1967 in memory of Mr Rupert Rowling's mother was returned to the Rowling family when the new kneelers were dedicated . A donation from Mrs May Wicks to the Mothers Union in 1977 was used to pay for the kneelers. The kneelers are beginning to show some signs of wear and the corners have recently been mended by Mrs Mary Radford.

From North to South:

1st KNEELER

The single decorative panel is headed with the word TRUTH. Below this is an open symbolic Bible with two book markers through the pages. On the left page is lettered AND YE SHALL KNOW THE TRUTH and on the right page AND THE TRUTH SHALL MAKE YOU FREE. The stitches used are rice, encroached gobelin, tent, back, stem and double cross stitch.

The size is: H 8cm w 48cm d 35cm. It was worked by Miss Sarah Hawken.



2^{ND} KNEELER

This is shaped at top right hand corner to accommodate buttress of altar rail gates. It has two decorative panels of equal size side by side.

In the first panel is a symbolic dove in shades of grey and white with wings displayed and a gold halo. Below is the inscription HOLY SPIRIT (left) and BAPTISM (right) in gold tent stitch.

In the second panel is a bell worked in shades of gold in reversed tent stitch with the inscription WORSHIP below. On the front drop of the kneeler is 1952 E II R 1977 to commemorate the Silver Jubilee of H M Queen Elizabeth II, in red within a gold lozenge. Stitches used are rice, encroached gobelin, tent, stem and cross stitch.

The size is: H 8cm w 114cm d 35cm.

It was worked by Mrs Ruth Dale.





3RD KNEELER

This is shaped at top corners to accommodate buttress of altar rail gates. It has a single decorative panel representing the Eucharist. The design of the gold cross in the centre was taken from the altar cross and is worked in double cross stitch, mosaic, tent and reversed ten stitches. On the left is a paten on which is a loaf of bread and on the right is a chalice. These are worked in white and shades of blue and grey and the designs were taken from the Elizabethan Chalice and Cover (used as a Paten) which are regularly used for Communion in the church. Stitches used are satin, encroached gobelin, tent, stem and mosaic stitch. Between the cross, chalice and paten is an interwoven pattern of grapes and vine leaves.

The size is: H 8cm w 152cm d 35cm.

It was worked by Mrs Ann Day.



4^{TH} KNEELER

This is shaped at top left hand corner to accommodate buttress of altar rail gates. It has two decorative panels of equal size side by side. In the first panel is CHI RHO on conjoined rings, symbolizing matrimony, worked in tent and stem stitch in shades of gold and brown with the inscription LOVE below in gold tent stitch. In the second panel is AGNUS DEI worked in baby crossed corners stitch. The lamb is in white and shades of grey with black for hooves and features. The halo is worked in tent stitch in shades of gold and the banner is in shades of grey tent stitch with the scarlet cross in rice and satin stitch. The inscription SACRIFICE is in gold tent stitch. On the front drop of the kneeler is 1876 MU 1976 in red within a gold lozenge, to commemorate the centenary of the Mothers Union. The size is: H 8cm w 115cm d 35cm.

It was worked by Mrs Joan Smith.



5[™] KNEELER

It has two decorative panels of equal size side by side. In the first panel is a bursting pomegranate, symbolizing resurrection. The skin of the fruit is worked in encroached gobelin and tent stitches in shades of pink and gold. The seeds are in satin and mosaic stitches in pinks, dull reds and pale green on a pale gold tent stitch ground. The stem is brown satin and tent stitches and the leaves in greens and golds in stem stitch. The inscription LIFE is in gold tent stitch. In the second panel is a 3 branched candlestick with three candles. The candlestick is worked in golds and browns using satin, stem, tent, reversed tent, mosaic and double cross stitches. The candles are palest gold tent stitch. The size is: H 8cm w 111cm d 35cm.

It was worked by Mrs Nora Corson, who also designed the second panel.



CLERGY KNEELERS CHANCEL

- 1. Two clergy kneelers with a central motif of a gold Moline cross with a green sunburst, worked in satin, rice, Hungarian and back stitch on a red background in tent stitch. There is a pale green border in Hungarian and back stitch in a square design. The sides are in the same stitch and design in pine green.

CHOIR STALL KNEELERS CHANCEL AND FAR WEST OF NAVE

An embroidery group worked on the kneelers with the 36 choir kneelers and those for clergy, the sanctuary and weddings being completed in 1965. A further set of 16 choir kneelers was completed in 1977.

36 kneelers with a red background with gold cross motifs in the centre – 13 have cross crosslets, 12 Moline crosses and 11 patee or formée (Maltese) crosses. They are worked in tent stitch. They were completed in 1965. They are all the same size: H 7cm w 39cm d 25cm.

They were designed by Mrs Ruth Dale and upholstered by Mr and Mrs Dale.

CHOIR KNEELERS CHANCEL

16 kneelers in a design adapted from 11th Century Persian design of cross and star shapes. The outline trellis is in crimson, infilled with shades of gold. The centres of the stars have simple crosses in cherry red. Stitches used are cross corner, rice, mosaic, cushion, satin, tent, and double cross stitch. They were completed in 1977. They are all the same size: H 7cm w 41cm d 27cm.

The design was adapted by Mrs Ann Day and they were upholstered by Mr HR Staplehurst.

ALTAR CUSHION SANCTUARY



The canvas cushion has a background and sides of pale beige crewel wool and gold metal thread worked in mosaic stitch, with a centre design of a flower head inset in pale blue tent stitch and bordered in gold satin stitch. On either side of the centre motif is a bird worked in pinks and golds, and above and below is a cross fleurette with inset border worked in red, blue and gold in tent, satin, rice and mosaic stitches. There is also a small flower design at each corner worked in tent stitches in blues and golds.



Ann Day created a series of designs for 34 kneelers combining various styles of cross with references to the church's interior features, such as floor tiles, door woodwork and carvings. The choice of colours and stitches was left to the individual needlewoman with the result that no two kneelers are exactly the same. They were worked in gold on backgrounds of green, blue or red.






